Adult plumage and soft part colours are acquired midway through the second year; So adults should be aged 2+ and immatures 2- or 1 – see above.

Sexing :

There is no sexual difference in plumage;

Males are larger than females, but there is a large overlap in measurement ranges in all except wing span. All females measured have been less than 460 mm and males were considerably greater. As a general guide - M > 465 mm; F < 465 mm; Only females incubate.
