SCIENTIFIC MEETING.

A Scientific Meeting followed the Annual General Meeting. "The First Ten Years of The Australian Bird Banding Scheme" was the subject of a paper presented by Mr. W. B. Hitchcock, Secretary of the Scheme. This paper will be published in the next issue.

Mr. S. J. Wilson spoke briefly on Cuckoos of the genus Chalcites with particular reference to the difficulty in classifying correctly the shining, Golden and Horsfield Bronze Cuckoos. A display of skins from the Museum was kindly arranged by Mr. Disney and several colour slides of the three species were shown. Mr. Wilson then presented a series of excellent colour slides of a wide range of Honeyeaters with an appropriate commentary. Slides of banding locations and habitat at Lake George, N.S.W., and of the Canberra Native Botanical Gardens were also shown.

Mr. Ron Mellor screened slides of recent wader trapping with a rocket-net at Botany Bay. Close-up shots showed some of the waders and terms caught during the operation.
