RECOVERY DETAILS

Recovery details are obtained mainly from two sources—

1. The Australian Bird-banding Scheme;

2. Individual banders.

The Secretary of the A.B.B.S. has kindly arranged for copies of interesting recoveries to be forwarded to the Association. It is neither possible nor expedient for all recoveries to be made available through this source; consequently some recoveries of considerable value may not be included in Recovery Round-up unless individual banders provide the details.

Recoveries 10 miles from banding place for some species considered sedentary may be of greater value than, for instance, a more spectacular shearwater recovery of 5,000 miles.

Banders are requested to forward to me (or the Hon. Editor) details of any recovery or retrap that they consider may be suitable for publication. The editor will finally determine which ones will be included. In order to avoid possible errors, the "Report to Bander" form should be forwarded. If the bander requires the form to be returned later, the top of the form should be clearly endorsed to this effect. The enclosure of a stamped, addressed envelope would be appreciated.
