AUSTRALIAN BIRD-BANDING SCHEME

List of Approved Projects

To date approximately 150 completed Project Application forms have been lodged with the office in compliance with the decisions of the Regional Organisers' Conference held in January last year. These have all now been circulated to the Review Committee and with the exception of six all have been approved.

The response to the change in policy of the Australian Bird-banding Scheme has been most gratifying and it is obvious that all banders have given a great deal of time and thought to the planning of their future activities and what they hope to achieve. However, many banders have not yet submitted Project Application forms or indicated the type of banding they wish to undertake. Knowing the interests of each bander also makes it easier for the Secretary to assist in many more ways than was before possible.

Now that the new system is operative, bands will only be supplied for use in approved projects. Should you be having any difficulties in regard to the choice of a project, or the type of banding to undertake, please seek the advice of your Regional Organiser or write direct to the Secretary.
