Immature plumage is attained by a combination of wear and partial moult at 4-5 months; Adult plumage is attained with a complete moult commencing when birds are just over one year old and coinciding with adult post-breeding season moult. Thus adults are (2+) and Immatures (2-);

Sexing:

All age classes can be sexed on plumage as juveniles and immatures show traces of respective adult plumage characters – see below:

Forehead & crown:	Adult Male dark blue-green with white edges to feathers, forming a distinctive streaky cap;	Adult Female bluish-olive-brown with white edges, forming a streaky cap;
