

Morphometrics:

Ageing:

Juveniles are readily separated from adults by plumage;

The tip of the alula of juveniles and immatures is rounded whereas adults are pointed;

Immatures retain juvenile remiges and rectrices;

First Immatures undergo moult at the same time as adults post-breeding. Thus adults should be aged as (2+) and Immatures (2-);

Sexing:

No difference in plumage between sexes, but males larger than females – female wing < 122 mm and 60% males >122 mm;

Incubation by helpers so brood patch is an unreliable sexing indicator.

Key to Black-throated Miners, hybrids and Yellow-throated Miners:

Assess the two plumage characters 1. Colour of feathering on mandibular rami (lower jaw) and its contrast with throat plumage colour; and 2. Degree of contrast between the dorsum and rump; then compare against the following key:
