


Cinnamon Quail-thrush *Cinlosoma cinnamomeum* Species No.: 439 Band size: 05



Morphometrics:

Measurements given below are for the nominate *C.c. cinnamomeum*. The Nullabour subspecies *C.c. alisteri* is smaller.

	Adult Male	Adult Female
Bill (tip to skull):	16.5 – 21.1 mm	17.5 – 20.7 mm
Wing:	81 – 93 mm	91 – 89 mm
Tail:	74 – 87 mm	70 - 87 mm
Weight:	52 – 66 g	50 – 65.5 g

Ageing:

Peter Marsack’s drawings above amply illustrate plumage differences between adults and immatures of the eastern subspecies;
 Immature females are almost indistinguishable from adults;
 Immatures appear to retain juvenile remiges, rectrices, greater coverts and alula;
 Synchronous growth bars in wing and tail are obvious indicators of retained juvenile feathers.

Sexing:

Adults differ in plumage and size with males larger than females;
 Juveniles are not plumage dimorphic.
 Both sexes recorded incubating.

Similar Species:

The Cinnamon Quail-thrush is known to cross-breed with the Chestnut-breasted Quail-thrush, hence the drawing above of a typical hybrid male.
