

Ageing:

Bill:	Adult (3+) black;	1 st Immature (1) dark grey-brown;	Juvenile (J) pinkish-brown, grading to pink at tip;
Gape:	black;	changes from orange- yellow to cream with age;	pale grey;
Iris:	varies from orange to red;	brown;	brown;

First immature males and females (approx. 3 months to 12 months old) are indistinguishable; Second immature males (from moult coinciding with adult post-breeding moult at approximately one year old) results in patchy black on breast and sides of throat – age (2);

Second immature female resembles adult female;

Moult to full male plumage coincides with post-breeding moult at the start of their third year – hence adults are (3+).

Sexing :

Obvious sexual dimorphism in plumage - see illustrations above; Both sexes incubate.
