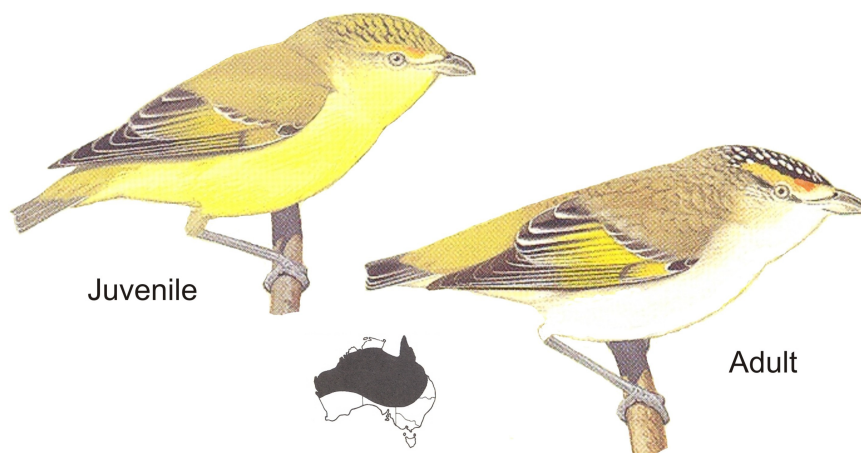


Red-browed Pardalote *Pardalotus rubricatus* **Species No.: 570** **Band size: 01**



Morphometrics:

Ageing:

	Adult (2+)	Immature (2-) or (1)	Juvenile (J)
Bill:	upper mandible dark grey, dark brown, black or grey-black with cream or light brown tip; lower mandible cream, off-white or greyish with grey tip;	similar to adult;	upper mandible similar to adult; lower mandible dark grey-brown;
Iris:	usually yellow-olive, straw-yellow, yellow-brown or yellow;	olive;	cream-grey or pale yellow with creamish or greyish tinge to outer edge;
Upper forehead, crown & nape:	black with rows of large white spots;	brownish-grey with distinct buff & grey-black scalloping;	straw-yellow with distinct grey-black scalloping or barring;
Supercillium:	yellow-brown or buff with upper edge in front of eye red or orange;	buff-yellow & upper edge in front of eye pale orange-yellow;	pale buff-yellow with upper edge in front of eye pale orange-yellow;
Breast:	off-white grading to pale buff at sides and with yellow patch in centre;	off-white with pale yellow suffusion;	pale yellow;
Belly:	off-white or cream;	off-white with pale yellow suffusion;	pale-yellow;

Immatures retain juvenile remiges.

Moult to adult plumage commences at approximately one year of age. So adults are aged (2+) and immatures (2-) or (1) depending on time of year and condition of plumage;

Sexing:

Not size dimorphic, but at least some females appear to have larger and more prominent yellow patch in the centre of the upper breast than do males. Also adult females may have buff suffusion to spots on the nape and may have a lighter coloured lower mandible than males;

Both sexes incubate.
