Head and body:

Juveniles undergo a complete post-juvenile moult within 2 months of fledging, resulting in adult plumage.

Sexing:

Sexes are similar and can probably only be separated when comparing members of a breeding pair: The male is said to have a slightly darker and larger mask, bib and flank patch (male – black; female – greyish-black) and an orange-yellow bill that is darker than the yellow bill of the female. Both sexes incubate.
