

Facial mask: see under sexing below; Upper breast: black and white spotting, or scalloping; Juvenile dark grey and acquire bluish wash to lower mandible with age; absent; light brown or dull pinkish-buff;

Immatures (see illustration above) acquire full adult plumage between 4 and 9 months after fledging;

Thus immatures are aged (1) and adults (1+).

Sexing :

Adults sexually dimorphic on plumage as follows: Adult Male Facial mask: black and bordered by pink-brown supercilium that extends past ear coverts to the side of neck Upper & mid breast: overlap sometimes giving an appearance of solid white, but bases are usually partly exposed resulting in a coarsely spotted appearance;

Adult Female blackish-brown and bordered by brownishgrey stripe that is narrower than in male;

narrower white tips to black feathers gives a more spotted or scalloped appearance rather than coarse spotting as in male.

Both sexes incubate.
