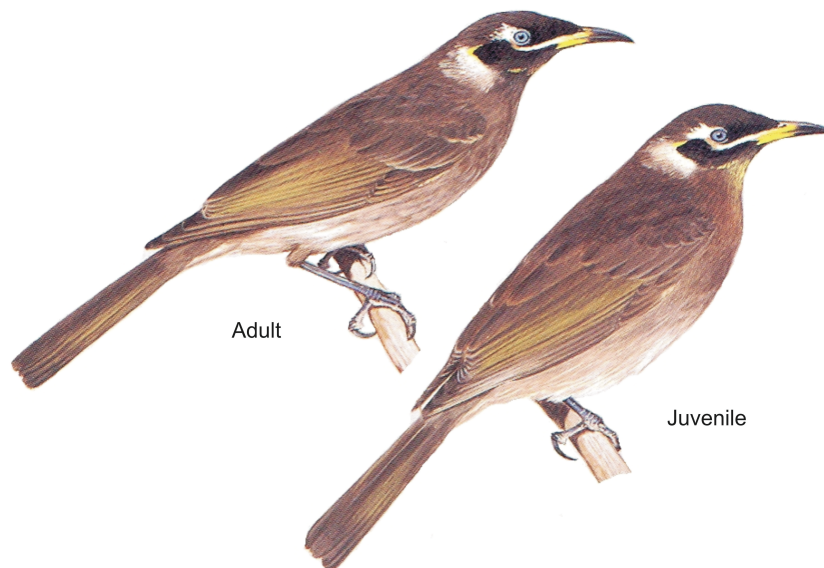


Bridled Honeyeater *Lichenostomus frenatus* Species No.: 611 Band size: 04 (03)



Morphometrics:

Ageing:

	Adult (1+)	Juvenile
Mantle, scapulars & back:	brown;	dark chocolate brown with indistinct and fine off-white striations on mantle, contrasting with rump;
Alula tip:	pointed;	rounded;
Rump:	brown;	brown;

Juvenile distinguished by plumage and shape of longest feather of alula, outer primaries and Rectrices;

First immature very similar or indistinguishable from adult; at least some retain some juvenile feathers, including one or more of longest feather of alula, remiges, rectrices and some feathers of hindneck or rump and retained juvenile remiges or rectrices may have synchronous fault or growth bars;

Immatures should be identifiable into their early second year, so immatures should be aged (2-) or (1) and adults (2+).

Sexing :

No plumage difference, but males are larger than females, but there appears to be a considerable overlap in measurements;
No information on brooding.
