

Juvenile distinguished by plumage and shape of longest feather of alula and rectrices; First immature very similar to adult, but some retain some juvenile feathers of rump and hindneck, which contrast with rest of upperparts. At least some first immatures retain longest feather of alula from juvenile and all juvenile remiges and rectrices sometimes distinguishable in the hand by synchronous fault-bars or growth-bars.

Immatures attain full adult plumage early in their second year coinciding with post breeding moult of adults – thus immatures are aged (2-) or (1) depending on time of year and state of plumage and adults are aged (2+).

Sexing :

Males are larger than females but there is no plumage difference; No data on incubation to separate sexes.
