

Hindneck collar:	male – white; female – greyish-white or pale grey;	buff-brown;	lacks collar;
Lower mantle, male – black;		blackish-brown or dark	dark brown with diffuse
back & rump:	female – blackish-brown;	brown;	cinnamon-brown scalloping;
Underparts:	white;	buff or cream with distinct faint, fine brownish-grey or dark-brown barring;	off-white with buff tinge strongest on lower breast, upper belly and thighs;

Juvenile moults to immature plumage within a few months of fledging; Immature thought to acquire adult plumage early in second year in complete moult coinciding with adult post-breeding moult;

Sexing:

Males slightly larger than females and plumage differences noted above; Only female incubates.
