

Regent Bowerbird (2 of 2)

Most adult females have longer wings than adult and immature males, but this difference (which is unique among passerines) is not as reliable for sexing as plumage and bare part differences that reliably identify the sexes and ages;

Bill & gape:	Immature Male (3) & (4) brownish-yellow;	Sub-adult Male (5) yellow with brownish stripe under lower mandible;	Adult Male (6+) dull orange or orange-yellow;
Iris:	mostly yellowish with numerous brown spots;	yellow with a few brown spots;	bright yellow;
Legs:	blackish;	as for adult male;	blackish or blackish brown, often with dark pinkish tinge to upper tarsus;
Head & neck:	as for adult female;	forehead & crown a mixture of yellow and dark brown feathers with some black feathers on face, lores & throat;	forehead, crown, nape hindneck & upper sides of neck vivid orange-yellow with diffuse orange-red or red patch in centre of crown & forehead with rest of face black with faint bluish sheen;
Overall appearance	as for adult female except e: as mentioned above;	dark brown & yellow with some black around head & blackish-brown tail feathers;	bright golden yellow and glossy black;

Adult females alone incubate and feed nestlings and juveniles.
