Juveniles undergo a partial moult soon after fledging to immature plumage that basically resembles adult plumage, but immatures retain some or all juvenile remiges and rectrices and other differences as noted above;

Adult plumage is acquired early in the second year, so all adult-plumaged birds are aged (2+).

Sexing:

No difference in plumage between the sexes, but adult males are considerably larger than adult females:
