

Ageing:

No information, but some immatures retain juvenile alula and all rectrices and remiges.

Sexing:

Sexes have identical plumage, but males are larger than females; It is not known whether both sexes incubate.

Similar Species:

Yellow-spotted Honeyeaters can be separated from the similarly plumaged Graceful Honeyeater by measurements, for example:

Yellow-spotted Honeyeater Weight: \geq 21.0 g, \leq 17.0 g

There is a small overlap in measurements with the similarly plumaged Lewin's Honeyeater, but those within the overlap range can usually be separated by the shape of the yellow facial markings.
