Morphometrics:

The following measurements have been obtained from the few museum specimens that exist (5 males and 5 females) and they combine both immatures and adult specimens:

Ageing:

Juveniles have a dark grey-brown base colour with mottled or diffuse broad white shaft streaks; Immature plumage (similar to adult) is attained in a partial post-juvenile moult and moult to adult plumage probably commences at about one year of age;

Immatures differ from adults by retained juvenile primaries, secondaries, primary coverts and tail; Synchronous growth bars are most conspicuous on secondaries rather than tail; Adults can be aged (2+).

Sexing:

The plumage of males and females differ in at least immature and adult plumages. As illustrated above – males have predominantly black chin, breast, flanks and belly, whereas females are rufous-brown;

Incubation apparently by female only.
