
Oriental Cuckoo Cuculus saturates Species No.: 336 Band size: 05 (06) AL



Morphometrics:

Migrant from Asia usually late November to May as a post-breeding migrant, but there are a few claimed records of birds breeding in northern Australia during July/August:

Ageing:

In all juvenile plumages there are white fringes to feathers of head, body and upperwing coverts; Post-juvenile moult occurs in the first austral summer, largely in non-breeding areas – such as Australia, with the resultant immature plumage similar to adult but generally retain a few remiges and rectrices:

Adult plumage attained when approximately 14 - 18 months, so age Adults (2+);

Sexing:

Sexes of adults are plumage dimorphic and males average larger than females;

All adult males have a grey ground colour, whereas adult females may be either a grey, or rufous morph;

Female grey morph has a rufous foreneck collar that extends around neck (see illustrations) which readily identify them from adult males;

Similar species:

Pallid Cuckoo Cuculus pallidus – differences as follows:

	Oriental Cuckoo	Pallid Cuckoo
Breast & belly:	heavily barred;	lacks barring;
Legs and feet:	orange;	grey.
