

Ageing:

Adult (1+) Juvenile/Immature

Bill: blackish-brown; dark olive-brown with darker base & tip;

Legs & feet: reddish-purple; pinkish-grey

Plumage: see below under sexing;

Juveniles moult to adult plumage within the first year; thus adults aged (1+).

Sexing:

No difference in size, but sexes can be determined in all plumages;

Adult Male Adult Female

Forehead & yellow-brown to light buff with off-white blue-grey with dull off-white bases forecrown: bases to feathers exposed with wear; making them look patchy with wear; Lores, ear coverts dark brown grading to white chin; dark brown grading to dirty grey chin;

& malar area:

Sides of neck: blue-grey;

Upperparts: dark olive-brown with light brown fringes

to feathers giving scaly appearance & two largest scapulars have green to

purple iridescent spots;

Breast: red-brown or pink-brown;

Upperwing: iridescent metallic green & bronze

bronze secondaries & coverts;

dull red-brown with blue-grey sheen;

less iridescence than adult male:

like adult male but without iridescent

pale blue-grey:

spots;

Immature Male Immature Female

Forehead: mixture of dull buff yellow and dirty grey; blue-grey;

Sides of neck: both sexes brown:

Breast: both sexes mottled brown to grey;

Both sexes incubate.
