

Post-juvenile moult results in immature plumage within 2 - 3 months of hatching and moult to adult plumage commences at about 1 year old. Thus adults are aged (2+). Adult females are considerably larger than males and can also be sexed on plumage characteristics as illustrated and as follows:

Immatures of both sexes can also be identified on the same plumage characteristics, they are simply paler than the adults – see illustrations;
