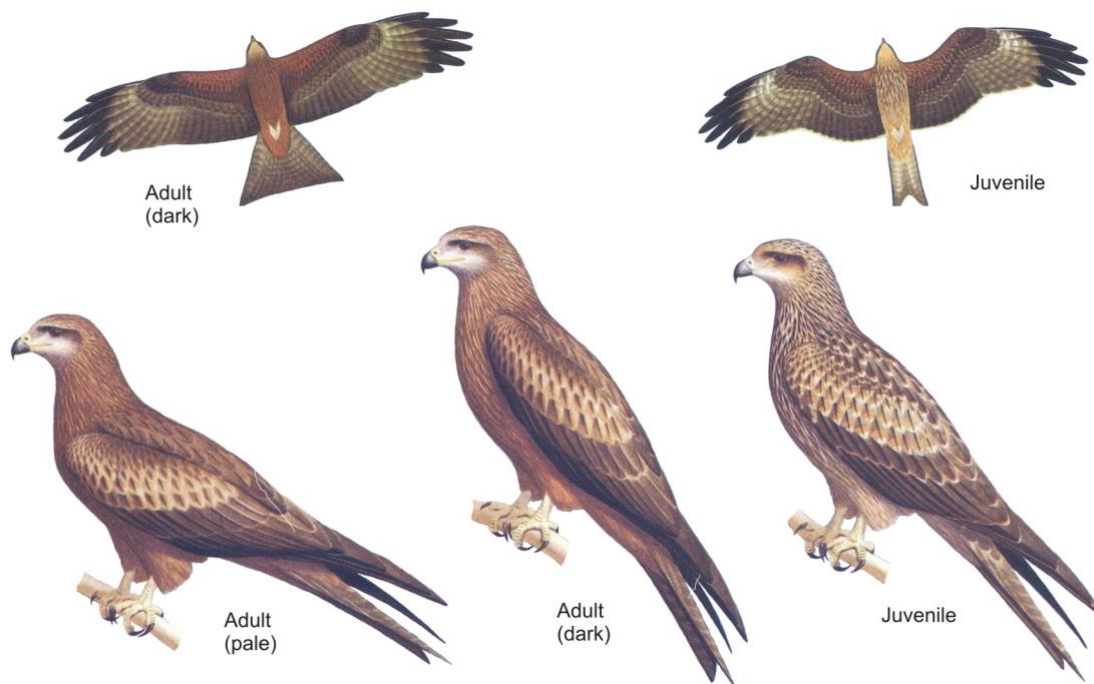


**Black Kite *Milvus migrans***

**Species No.: 229**

**Band size: 10M 11F SS**



**Morphometrics:**

There are ten recognised subspecies of *M. migrans*, but only *M.m. affinis* occurs in Australia and its measurements are as follows:

Wing:	375 – 420 mm	401 – 432 mm
8 <sup>th</sup> Primary:	272 – 324 mm	306 – 350 mm
Tail:	221 – 286 mm	230 – 288 mm
Bill (cere):	20.5 – 25.1 mm	21.6 – 25.5 mm
Tarsus:	44.0 – 51.6 mm	46.5 – 53.7 mm
Weight:	500 – 640 g	560 – 671 mm

**Ageing:**

	Adult (2+)	Juvenile
Bill:	black;	black;
Cere:	yellow;	yellow to greenish;
Iris:	dark brown, brown or hazel;	dark brown;
Legs & feet:	yellow, orange-yellow or pale yellow;	pale yellow;
Crown & neck:	light brown, thinly streaked with black-brown;	dark brown with elongated bold cream streaks;
Upper breast:	dark brown with blackish streaks;	dark brown with broad cream to buff streaks;

Adult plumage is attained by a post-juvenile moult commencing toward the end of the first year; Thus adults are aged (2+).

**Sexing:**

Females are marginally larger than males, but huge overlap in size ranges;  
 Females may also average slightly paler than their mates;  
 Not known whether both sexes incubate.
