

Ageing:

Adult (2+) Juvenile

Cere: pale grey; pale yellowish to yellowish white

Iris: red-brown to brown; dark brown; Feet: whitish to pale grey, often with light flesh-grey;

blush greenish, or yellowish tinge;

Adult-like plumage is attained in post-juvenile moult, but definitive plumage may not be reached then. Adults will at least be in their second year, so age adults (2+).

Sexing:

Females are generally larger than males, but there is some size overlap in all measurements. Be aware that males may have a tarsus smaller in diameter than females, so always try the size 13 band first on males and only use size 12 if size13 is so large that it might bind the toes.

Both sexes incubate.
