
Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybridus Species No.: 110 Band size: 05 AY



Morphometrics:

Three subspecies worldwide – measurements for the Australian ssp. C.h. javanicus follow:

Wing:	231 – 235 mm	204 – 234 mm
Tail:	66 – 83 mm	63 – 82 mm
Bill:	28.1 – 33.2 mm	24.7 – 30.8 mm

Toe:	25.2 – 29.4 mm	24.4 – 27.7 mm
Weight:	80 – 110 g	80 – 96 g

Ageing:

Moult sequence is poorly known for immatures / sub-adults;

Adults moult twice yearly – a complete post-breeding moult and a partial pre-breeding moult; See illustrations;

Age of first breeding is not known, but breeding birds will be at least (2+).

Sexing:

No sexual dimorphism in plumage;

Males may be heavier and larger in all measurements than females, but there are large size range overlaps;

Both sexes incubate.

Similar species:

White-winged Black Tern in non-breeding plumage (see separate field data sheet) which differs by:

- slightly smaller and slimmer with slightly shorter narrower wings and shorter tail;
- shorter and finer bill;
- generally darker and mottled solid black crown;
- black spot on ear coverts extends further below level of eye;
- white behind dark ear coverts extends further up toward crown;
- upperparts are darker grey with contrasting darker upper edge to mantle;
- prominent dark carpal (cubital) bar on inner upper wing:
- Juveniles have distinctively different plumage (see illustrations in the separate field data sheets).
