
Paperbark Flycatcher Myiagra nana Species No.: 722 Band size: 02 (03)



Morphometrics:

Found in northern Australia from the Kimberley region of WA east to the south-western portion of Cape York Peninsular.

Ageing:

Juvenile and immature, see drawings;

First Immature – similar to adults, but retain brown alula and other wing feathers;

Adult plumage attained late first or early second year;

Sexing:

Adult Male
Upperparts: mostly black, but back and rump grey-black all with bluish sheen;
Lores, eye-ring & black;
Adult Female
slightly duller than male with less sheen;
chark grey;

Lores, eye-ring & ear coverts:

usually white, but may have dull

usually has orange-buff flush;

orange-buff flush reducing with age;

Breast:

The Restless Flycatcher *Myiagra inquieta* occurs in southern and eastern Australia to the eastern half of Cape York Peninsular. It is very similar in plumage to the Paperbark Flycatcher, but is considerably larger – see separate profile sheet.
