

Bill:	Adult (1+) pink or dirty pink basally, grading	Juvenile grey-black, slightly paler toward
<b>5</b>	to light pink-brown distally;	tip, becoming dark grey-brown with

Iris:	bright red to crimson;	dark grey initially, then brown and begins turning red by three months;
Legs & feet:	light pink-brown to light pink-grey;	initially grey with pin tinge
Upperparts:	brown-olive;	more reddish-brown than adults;
Underparts:	light olive-grey;	browner than adults;
Tips of primaries:	rounded;	pointed;

Adult plumage is attained within the first year.

Birds aged over seven years (7+) gradually acquire white feathers among ear coverts, crown and nape feathers;

## Sexing:

Males generally have a longer bill and tarsus than females. A discriminant function has been calculated for live birds (Z = 1.7 x tarsus + bill); males > 141 and females < 141; Both sexes incubate.
