


Plains-wanderer

Morphometrics:

Ageing:

Natal down is replaced by distinctive juvenile plumage from 3 – 5 weeks after hatching;
 Timing of moult to sexually identifiable plumage is not well known;
 Juveniles differ from adult males as follows:

	Adult Male (1+)	Juvenile (J) or (1)
Crown:	black-brown strongly scalloped light brown & less strongly scalloped white;	black-brown with light brown spots & indistinct white scalloping;
Upper parts:	brown, closely vermiculated black-brown & variably streaked or scalloped white, ground colour of feathers is light brown;	black vermiculation is generally finer & more widely spaced than adult, light brown ground colour is generally more yellowish;
Upper breast:	buff to orange-buff grading to white bases & fringes – each feather has a strongly convex black-brown subterminal bar;	warm buff, heavily speckled dark-brown;
Under-tail:	coverts buff grading to white bases with black-brown subterminal bands;	coverts buff heavily speckled dark brown;

Sexing:

Sexually dimorphic on plumage (see illustrations);
 Most incubation is undertaken by the male.
