
Peaceful Dove Geopelia placida Species No.: 030 Band size: 06 (05) AY



Status:

Formerly identified as a subspecies of the Zebra Dove *Geopelia striata* of s.e. Asia, the Australian ssp. *G.s. placida* was elevated to species level in 2014 as *Geopelia placida*.

Upper wing: secondary coverts pale grey with secondary coverts brownish-grey with

black terminal fringes; white tips;

Juvenile begins moult directly to adult plumage within two months of fledging;

Sexing:

There is no documented sexual difference in plumage, soft parts or size, though morphometric data in HANZAB (above) suggests that adult males are larger than adult females;

feathers tipped white;

Also, some eminent aviculturists and some banders (pers. comm. to J.W. Hardy) claim that the sexes within a pair are readily separated by the colour of the bare skin around the eye - the male is a considerably brighter blue than the female which is a dull greyish blue; Both sexes incubate.
