
Spotted Quail-thrush Cinclosoma punctatum Species No.: 436 Band size: 06



Morphometrics:

Measurements given below are for the nominate *C.c. punctatum* of s-e Queensland, eastern NSW, Victoria and s-e SA. The other two subspecies *C.c. anachoreta* of the Mt. Lofty Ranges, SA and *C.c. dovei* of Tasmania may both be a slightly smaller, but there few records to confirm.

Ageing:

The illustrations above show the plumage differences between adults and juveniles; Immature females are almost indistinguishable from adult females; Immature males appear to have some plumage features of both adult sexes; Immatures appear to retain juvenile remiges, rectrices, greater coverts and alula; Synchronous growth bars in wing and tail are obvious indicators of retained juvenile feathers; Adult plumage is thought to be attained early in their second year coinciding with adult post-breeding moult. Therefore age adults (2+).

Sexing:

Adults differ in plumage and size with males larger than females; Juveniles are not plumage dimorphic. Both sexes recorded incubating.
