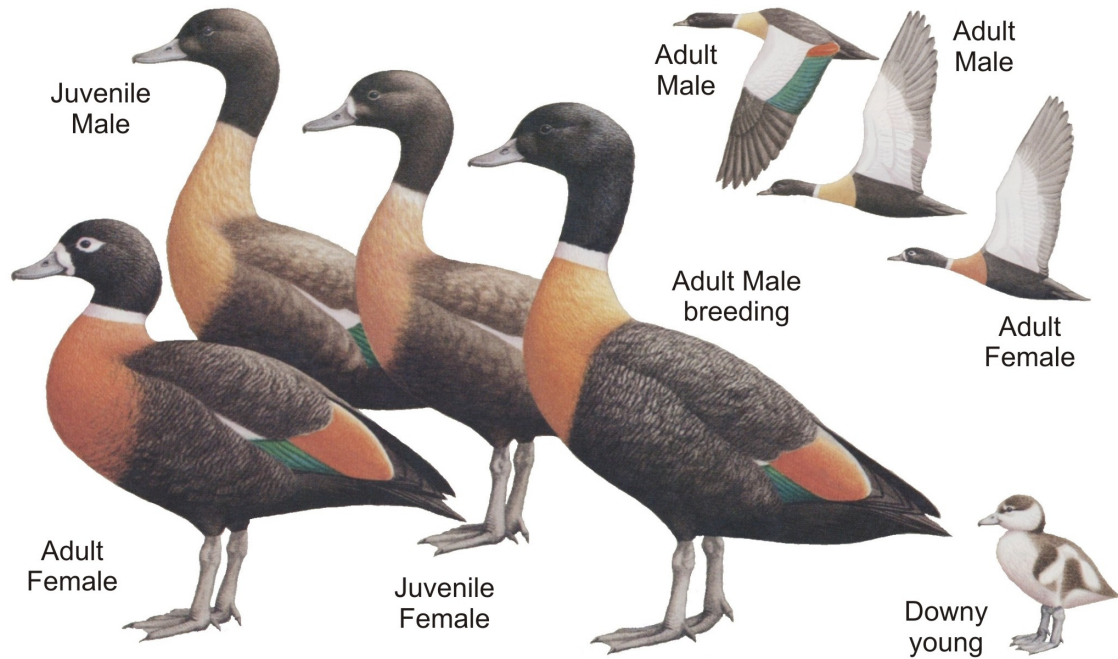


Australian Shelduck *Tadorna tadornoides* **Species No.: 207** **Band size: 12 SS AM**

Ageing:

Juvenile plumage (see illustrations) is retained for about 4 months and then undergo a partial moult to Immature plumage in which Juvenile wing and belly feathers are retained for up to 19 months;

Sexing:

Juvenile (J) and Immature (2-) birds are sexually dimorphic on plumage with the female having off-white feathers at the base of the bill;
 Adults are sexually dimorphic on plumage – females have white feathers at the base of the bill and nearly always also have a white eye-ring;
 Age at first breeding in wild birds is unknown;
 Female alone incubates.
