

## Ageing:

Juveniles (J) undergo a partial moult to first immature (1) plumage, but retain remiges and rectrices, and attain breeding plumage toward the end of the first year. Thus adult birds (breeding and non-breeding plumages) are aged (2+);

## Sexing:

Adult male may be larger than adult female in some measurements, but large overlap; Sexes similar in plumage; Both sexes incubate.
