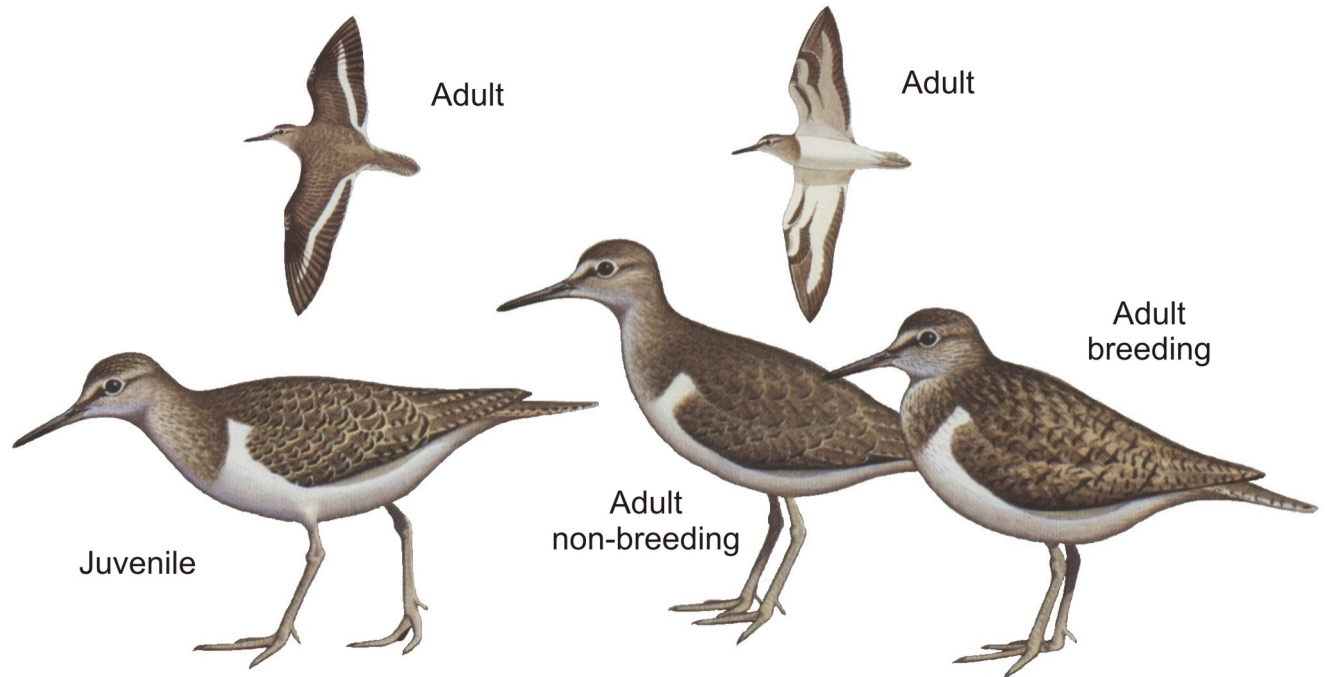


Common Sandpiper *Actitus hypoleucos* Species No.: 157 Band size: 04 IN



Morphometrics:

Ageing:

Juveniles are similar to adult non-breeding, but with finer barring on wing coverts and spotted edges to tertials;

Condition of remiges is the most obvious guide to age:

- from August to December juvenile primaries are fresh while primaries of adults are worn (August) or in moult (December);
- from January to March juveniles are moulting primaries while adults have new primaries;
- after moult is completed in late March to April immatures are similar to adults but their plumage is slightly duller;

Immature (1) plumage is attained by late March of the first year;

Probably first breed in second year, so age adults (2+).

Sexing:

No sexual dimorphism in size or plumage.
