
## Red-necked Avocet Recurvirostra novaehollandiae Species No.: 148 Band size: 08 on tibia

## Ageing:

	Adult	Juvenile
Head & neck:	chestnut;	rufous-brown;
Iris:	black-brown to dark reddish-brown or red;	dark brown in juveniles, reddish- drown and dark brown in immatures;
Upperparts:	mostly white, with narrow black stripes down inner scapular	brownish mottled appearance;

Chicks hatch in natal down and grow rapidly as they moult to a distinctively juvenile plumage; Partial post juvenile moult occurs in first Summer / Autumn but does not include primaries or primary coverts, but otherwise is difficult to distinguish from adults;

Adult plumage is attained at about one year old, so age adults (2+).

## Sexing:

There is a marginal difference in measurements with adult males being slightly larger than adult females:

Females have a more steeply upcurved bill than males and less black on tip of primaries; Not known whether both sexes incubate.
