Status:

Some references regard the Silver-backed Butcherbird as *Cracticus torquatus argenteus*, a subspecies of the Grey Butcherbird, but since 2006, others have classified it as a separate species, based on its size and its restricted distribution n.w Australia being widely separated from other Grey Butcherbird subspecies. Two subspecies: nominate *C.a. argenteus* and ssp. *C.a. colletti*.

Ageing:

Little information on plumages;

Adults plumage is not attained until at least toward the end of the second year, so age adults (2+).

Sexing:

In the nominate *C.a argenteus* adult males are larger than adult females, but that does not appear to be the case with *C.a colletti*.;

Sexes are thought to be indistinguishable on plumage;

Both sexes incubate.
