Morphometrics:

The Spotted Scrubwren was taxonomically separated from the White-browed Scrubwren *Sericornis frontalis* in 2019. Four subspecies are recognised with three of these being illustrated above. The distribution of the subspecies are recorded as follows:

S.m maculatus – s.w. WA from Bremer Bay–Hopetoun NW to Jurien Bay-Dongara;

S.m. ashbi - Kangaroo lis, SA;

S.m. balstoni – w. WA from Jurien Bay-Dongara to Shark Bay;

S.m mellori – coastal Gulf St. Vincent and s. Yorkeand s. Eyre Pens in SA and s.e coastal WA to Hopetoun-Bremer Bay and n. to inner wheatbelt.

There is very little variation in the measurements between the subspecies, but those for the nominate *S.m. maculatus* are provided here as a sample:

Sexing

Sexually dimorphic plumage and males may be slightly larger than females; Males – black lores and some also black behind the eye between eyebrow and moustacial stripes; Females – grey to brown lores and behind eye; Incubation by female only.
