This section is prepared with the co-operation of the Secretary, Australian Bird and Bat Banding Schemes, Australian Nature Conservation Agency. The recoveries are only a selection of the thousands received each year; they are not a complete list and should not be analysed in full or part without prior consent of the banders concerned. Longevity and distance records refer to the ABBBS unless otherwise stated. The distance is the shortest distance in kilometres along the direct line joining the place of banding and recovery; the compass direction refers to the same direct line. (There is no implication regarding the distance flown or the route followed by the bird). Where available ABBBS age codes have been included in the banding data.

Recovery or longevity items may be submitted directly to me whereupon their merits for inclusion will be considered.

161-76565. Adult (1+) banded by S. G. Lane on Woody Island, Archipelago of the Recherche, WA on 26 Oct. 1982. Recaptured, released alive with band at banding place by C. Powell on 20 March 2000, over 17 years 4 months after banding.

Macquarie Shag Leucocarbo purpurescens

130-23328. Adult (1+) banded at Handspike Point, Macquarie Island,
Tas. on 5 Dec. 1963. Recaptured, released alive with band at banding place on 26 Dec. 1975, over 12 years after banding.
(This is the oldest recorded for the species.)

Brown Falcon Falco berigora

100-86344. Nestling banded by J. Klapste at Werribee, Vic. on 21 Nov. 1983. Recaptured, released alive with band at banding place by P. G. McDonald on 13 Nov. 1999, over 15 years 11 months after banding. (This is the oldest recorded for the species.)

Ruddy Turnstone Arenaria interpres

051-81383. Adult (1+) banded by AWSG at Beaches Crab Creek Road, Roebuck Bay, Broome, WA (18°00'S, 122°22'E) on 11 Apr. 1993. Recovered dead (shot) at Syagannakh, Yakutia, Russia (68°23'N,143°39'E) in May 1996. 9 755 km N.

Pacific Gull Larus pacificus

110-90410. Nestling banded by B. I. Robertson on Norman Island, Vic. on 28 Dec. 1983. Recaptured (tangled in fishing gear) released alive with band at Tidal River, Wilsons Promontory National Park, Vic. on 30 Dec. 1999, over 16 years after banding. 5 km ESE.

Bridled Tern Sterna anaethetus

061-21290. Adult (2+) banded by R. E. Johnstone on North Fisherman Island, WA (30°08'S, 114°57'E) on 5 Jan. 1981. Recovered exhausted, later died at Mantabuan, Tawi-Tawi, Philippines (05°02'N, 120°13'E) on 4 Nov. 1998, over 17 years 9 months after banding. 3 949 km N.

Emerald Dove Chalcophaps indica

072-13023. Adult (1+) banded by J. D. A. Grant at Lake Barrine National Park, Qld. on 24 Nov. 1995. Recovered dead at Kuranda, Qld. on 15 Aug. 1999. 46 km N.

(This is the longest movement recorded for the species.)

Common Koel Eudynamys scolopacea

(a) 090-70508. Nestling female banded by S. G. Lane at Red Rock, NSW on 2 Jan. 1990. Recovered dead near Corindi Beach, NSW on 13 Dec. 1999, over 9 years 11 months after banding. 6 km SSW.

(b) 091-29311. Imature (1) rehabilitated by the WBRG and released at Chittaway Grid Block, NSW on 1 Jan. 1997. Recaptured, released alive with band at Charmhaven, NSW on 25 Nov. 1999. 11 km NNE.

Buff-breasted Paradise-Kingfisher Tanysiptera sylvia

Lewin's Honeyeater Meliphaga lewinii

Yellow-tufted Honeyeater Lichenostomus melanops

032-04295. Immature (1) banded by D. I. Smedley at Munghorn Gap Nature Reserve near Mudgee, NSW on 26 Apr. 1991. Recaptured, released alive with band at banding place twice, the last occasion by A. J. Leishman on 24 Apr. 2000, over 8 years 11 months after banding. (Bird was also banded with band No. 034-48597 due to wear of original band.)

Rufous-throated Honeyeater Conopophila rufogularis

023-36647. Adult (1+) banded at Broome Bird Observatory, WA by the Warden on 21 Dec. 1990. Recaptured, released alive with band at banding place on 20 Jan. 1999, over 8 years after banding.

(This is the oldest recorded for the species)

White-faced Robin Tregellasia leucops

Little Shrike-thrush Colluricincla megarhyncha

Little Raven Corvus mellori

100-41870. Adult (1+) banded by E. B. Thomas 25 km N of Barham, NSW on 11 Aug. 1964. Recovered dead (shot) near banding place on 9 May 1975, over 10 years 8 months after banding.

Richard's Pipit Anthus novaeseelandiae
