Obituary

John Douglas Gibson, one of our foundation members, died on 21 May 1984 after a long illness. He was one of the small group of banders who visited the Five Islands, N.S.W., in 1955 to commence a study of Silver Gulls and Crested Terns, one of the initial co-operative studies of the Australian Bird-Banding Scheme. His interest in the Five Islands continued and expanded into a broader ornithological involvement on committees of various trusts and societies of the south coast of N.S.W.

Also, in 1955 he recognised the potential of a winter feeding site of the Wandering Albatross at Bellambi, N.S.W., where he demonstrated that the birds could be captured and banded with relative case. The albatross banding project commenced in 1956, and his reports of the N.S.W. Albatross Study Group give some indication of the truly exciting data obtained and the scale of the enthusiastic international co-operation that study stimulated.

The project continues, and Doug will always be remembered for this contribution to ornithology by his colleagues at home and abroad.

Our profound sympathy goes to Betty, his wife, and to their daughters, Jacqueline and Terrie.
