
Black-browed Albatross Thalassarche melanophris Species Code.: 045 Band: M/O



Status:

Former subspecies *T.m. impavida* elevated to species status in 2008 as Campbell Albatross *Thalassarche impavida*.

Ageing:

Plumage gradually becomes whiter on crown, hindneck and foreneck and underwing;

By three years of age the head is almost indistinguishable from adult;

Adult plumage attained at 4-5 years:

Age recorded of first return to breeding islands varies from 3 years to 6.4 years;

Youngest age recorded of first breeding is 7 years, but varies up to 11 years on some islands.

Sexing:

Current data suggest that birds might be sexed on the length of the middle toe, with males being longer than females, but more data is required;

Both sexes incubate.

Similar species:

Campbell Black-browed Albatross *Thalassarche impavida* – apart from measurements, the easiest distinguishing feature is pale yellow to white iris, whereas adult Black-browed Albatross has a dark brown iris;

Black-browed x Campbell Black-browed Albatross hybrids have been recorded on several breeding islands – HANZAB has no illustrations or descriptions to identify hybrids, but obvious hybrids should be recorded with Species Code 904 & Band M.
