Status:

Elevated in 2003 from subspecies of the Shy Albatross *T. cauta eremita*. Breeds only on Chatham Is., NZ.

Ageing:

Juveniles have a darker head than adults and a fully black bill, but adults have a primarily bright yellow bill (see illustrations

Immature plumages show a gradual lightening of the crown, hindneck and foreneck through successive moults;

Full adult plumage is attained in either the fourth or fifth year at sea;

Age at first breeding unknown.

Sexing:

Methods used for sexing in the field are not documented, but measurements above suggest that males may be larger than females;

Incubation by both sexes in alternate shifts

Similar species:

Tasmanian (Shy) Albatross *T. cauta* and New Zealand White-capped Albatross *T. steadi* have a light grey head with a whitish crown (see separate field data sheets);

Salvin's Albatross *Thalassarche salvini* has a lighter grey head and adults have a pale yellow bill with a black tip to the lower mandible and the bill is slightly longer than T. eremita (see separate field data sheet).
