
Salvin's Albatross Thalassarche salvini Species Code.: 052 Band: M/O



Status:

Elevated in 2003 from subspecies of the Shy Albatross *T. cauta salvini.* Breeds on Snare's and Bounty Islands, NZ.

Ageing:

Juveniles have a darker head than adults and a fully black bill, but adults have a primarily pale yellow bill (see illustrations);

Immature plumages undergo a gradual lightening of the crown, hindneck and foreneck through successive moults;

Full adult plumage is attained in either the fourth or fifth year at sea;

Age at first breeding unknown.

Sexing:

Methods used for sexing in the field are not documented, but measurements above suggest that males may be larger than females;

Incubation by both sexes in alternate shifts.

Similar species:

Tasmanian (Shy) Albatross *T. cauta* and White-capped Albatross *T. steadi* have a light grey head with a whitish cap (see separate field data sheet);

Chatham Island Albatross *T. eremita* has a much darker blue-grey head with a bright yellow bill that has a black tip to the lower mandible and the bill is slightly shorter than T. salvini (see separate field data sheet).
