
Black Kite Milvus migrans



Species Code: 273

Band: [Male S, Female L]

Morphometrics:

There are ten recognised subspecies of *M. migrans*, but only *M.m. affinis* occurs in Australia and as a vagrant in New Zealand. Its measurements are as follows:

Ageing:

Adult (2+) Juvenile

Bill: black; black;

Cere: yellow; yellow to greenish;

Iris: dark brown, brown or hazel; dark brown; Legs & feet: yellow, orange-yellow or pale pale yellow;

Crown & neck: light brown, thinly streaked with dark brown with elongated bold

black-brown; cream streaks;

Upper breast: dark brown with blackish streaks; dark brown with broad cream to buff

streaks;

Adult plumage is attained by a post-juvenile moult commencing toward the end of the first year; Thus adults are aged (2+).

Sexing:

Females are marginally larger than males, but huge overlap in size ranges; Females may also average slightly paler than their mates; Not known whether both sexes incubate.
